Other times it is asked in a semi sarcastic manner. When I first started working in Epiphany I knew there was this Board somewhere. I had no idea who they were or what they did. I will give you the very short version here, and in doing so tell you who can give you all the information about the Board.

Each individual Unit Team should have a Unit Advisory Committee. The UAC elects a representative to the State Board and other officers. The Chairman of that Committee, and the elected State Board Rep are members of the State Epiphany Board. So within your Unit Team you have at least two State Board members. Some Units will have more do to internal elections on the State Board.

The State Board takes care of maintaining manuals and training manuals. It provides training, and oversight so that all units adhere to the manual. The Board maintains and invests Epiphany funds. Those funds used to provide, and maintain equipment, or cover large ticket items for the various units.

Board members are frequently the first team members of a start up Unit. The actual list of what the Board does is long. That is a very skimpy explanation. If you want more information, find out who from your team is on the Board and talk to them. They are the persons who carry your comments, concerns, and ideas to the State Board.

I wanted to share with you all, my experience on Epiphany #24. I was blessed to be Lay Director for Epiphany #24. It was quite challenging from the start. We had 10 team members drop out of this Epiphany. Almost all of them due to serious illnesses. But we didn't let that discourage us. We prayed and trusted that God would send the people he wanted to complete the team. One of our newest team members felt lead to send out a mass email to the La Mesa De Dios Emmaus Community. And through that email God sent us people who have a heart for these kids and this ministry. God is so good!

We had 18 young men on Epiphany #24. They are a great group of kids. Good natured and respectful. This group really loves to sing and worship. They seemed to be a little bit more reserved in some ways than some of our past Stars. But you can never tell sometimes what's going on under the surface. Some of these young men have learned to not show or share their emotions. Not by word, gesture, or even

It said "If anyone would like to pray with their Weekend Guide (a team member that was assigned to mentor them) you may meet with them at this time."

That's when Holy Spirit showed up with a big SHABANG!

Next thing I know all these kids are praying with their Weekend guides. Walls came crashing down. Many of the emotions they had been holding in

came out in a flood of tears. Forgiveness and healing began in that cell block that night. It was glorious to witness! God is so good!

All 18 young men either accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior or rededicated their lives to Christ. All 18 received their crosses and openly declared their love for Jesus. And the prayer that I have been praying over these kids was answered. The Scripture for Epiphany #24 was:

"I will give them a heart to know me, that I am Lord. They will be my people, and I will be their God, for they will return to me with all their heart." Jeremiah 24:7

God is so good!
